






Maturity Model for Corporate Security










Strategic Roadmap to Enable Success





01 Track

- Goal: Understand the magnitude of the problem. Monitor. Visibility.
- Challenge: Seen as a cost center. Limited Resources.



02 Enrich

- Goal: Understand the context of specific incidents and start to find the connections between them. First step in reducing incidents.
- Challenge: You can illustrate the value of the security teams' efforts through cost savings, but it's still ad hoc – incident by incident requiring a lot of manual work.



03 Optimize

- Goal: Optimize resource allocation to reduce the frequency and severity of negative events.
- Challenge: Often requires change to policy and procedure which requires more organizational buy-in.



04 Anticipate

- Goal: Catch incidents before they happen
- Challenge: Requires a significant step up in technology (integration, third party data, business intelligence tools, etc.)




05 Innovate

- Goal: Predict incidents and find non-obvious patterns
- Challenge: The technology exists but has not been productized


